This Association was formed on 15th December 1955. On 20th December 1980 we celebrated our Silver Jubilee

During these 29 years we have been able to help the members, who are most y ex-servicemen, in many ways. Although the main requirement of the members was financial help in order to purchase school books, medicines, etc, we found that our financial resources were insufficient to meet the demand. To overcome this the Executive Committee of 1983 decided to start a "Chairman's Fund." The aim of this Fund was mainly to help the members to purchase medicines which could not be obtained from hospitals, clinics, etc. The Committee appealed for help to the entire Membership and also to all those who were at one time members of The Signal Corps and who are abroad, especially in Australia.

We are happy to record that the response was tremendous and many have contributed liberally to the Fund. We feel very satisfied that we now have some means of helping the needy members. We sincerely hope that more members will help this Fund so that we could use it for other purposes too.

Another achievement of the Association has been that we were able to obtain a scholar-ship for the son of a member who is now a fully qualified Doctor. This was granted by the Sri Lanka Ex-servicemen's Association.

Our Headquarters are the Ex-servicemen's Institute at Bristol Street, where certain facilities are available for members. This year we conducted a knock-out Snooker Tournament in the Institute mainly to foster better fellowship. The Association conducted the entire tournament and donated The Signals Trophy to the winner and many other prizes. This Tournament will be an annual event and we hope to conduct other competitions also during the ensuing year. This is the first ever Tournament conducted in the Institute,

Our aim is to help our members who have given of their best to the country as best as we can but today we are gathered together to collect funds to help our beloved motherland in a crisis. We hope that our contributions, even though small will help us to have peace and harmony which all of us so earnestly desire.
